jQuery: start and stop CSS animations

CSS animations are bound to elements with the animation-name property. As the W3C specifications state, "once an animation has started it continues until it ends **or the animation-name is removed**". By knowing this, we can actually start and stop CSS animations with jQuery.

Suppose that we have the following infinite CSS animation:

```
@keyframes grow {
        0% {
                 width: 100px;
                 height: 100px;
        }
        100% {
                 width: 120px;
                 height: 120px;
        }
}
#animated {
        width: 100px;
        height: 100px;
        background: silver;
        margin: 1em 0;
        animation: grow 1s infinite;
}
```

The solution is simple and consists of a specialized CSS class that removes the animation from the selected element:

```
#animated.off {
    animation-name: none;
}
```

Toggling animations with jQuery is a simple matter of adding and removing a CSS class:
